
Free Church Mission Statement

The Free Church Saint Ives

The Free Church, located in the Centre of historic St Ives can trace its origins to Oliver Cromwell whose statue stands outside the building in Market Hill. The present building was erected in 1865 and in 1979 was refurbished, converted and renovated to produce the building as it now exists.

The re-dedication took place in 1980 and since then it has been used as the Church at the heart of the community.

Worship

As part of the reconstruction of the building a small chapel was created adjacent to the front entrance and each weekday at 10.00 a.m. all are welcome to



join us in prayers for 15 minutes. At all other times when the building is open the chapel can be used for personal prayer and quietness.

Sunday Worship is at 11.00 a.m. and Holy Communion is celebrated on the first Sunday of

The Free Church at the heart of the Community of St Ives each month. On the second Sunday of each month a joint reflective Evening Service is held at our sister church at Fenstanton at 6.00 p.m.

Church & Community Life

In service to the community the Church provides and hosts a wide range of facilities and activities of which some are undertaken and sponsored by the church and others by social, welfare and cultural groups in the Town. The many activities range include Short Mat Bowls, Tots & Carers, RSPB, Civic Society and Photographic Club with Choral Society and other Concerts for good measure. Counselling and mental health groups also regularly use the premises. Additionally on the ground floor is **Tookeys' Coffee Shop** named after the first "lecturer" or pastor appointed to the town by Oliver Cromwell and our Fair Trade Shop - "**Just Sharing.**"

This wide range of social, cultural and welfare activities is part of our outreach into the community.
