From the choir side

We started rehearsing this work back in September 2015, and at first a good number of us were not exactly enthusiastic! Trawling through friends and acquaintances the only person who had heard of it and sung in it was Brian Lodde, back in a previous existence! With our Director Julian's insistence that this was a GREAT work, we pressed on. When has he ever been wrong?



Come Saturday 7th May, afternoon rehearsal in Ely Cathedral: all traces of surround sound disappearing upwards (into Lantern), soloists voices a distant echo.......catastrophe! The evening performance could only improve, and much to our and I'm sure Julian's relief it did!

Most of our St Ives friends past and present seemed to be in a satisfyingly large audience! We were

also delighted to have the support of our town Mayor and Mayoress, Ian and Gilly Jackson. They all loved it, and for some it was a truly spiritual experience. So thanks again go to Julian for leading us so surefootedly to a work of great depth and complexity, a very memorable evening for us all.







Not singing this time, but having sung in Ely with the choir twice before, I could imagine the nervous excitement and anticipation amongst choir, orchestra and soloists! What a work! I have to confess that I had hardly heard of it, let alone listened to it. I had been warned that there were no "sing-a-long" tunes but I hadn't anticipated the intricacies of the whole work as Elgar weaves all the elements together to make a harmonious whole. I was glad that we had the words before us as the interplay of choir and soloists did sometimes make it difficult to follow the "storyline" exactly. How Julian manages to control the three elements of instruments, choral singing and solos/duets is a mystery akin to three dimensional weaving! A couple of the soloists will I'm sure make successful solo careers and I will look out for them in the future!

Dear choir, you needn't have worried! As always you sounded wonderful and produced a truly spiritual performance! It was well worth the hard work!
