We have recently received a letter and this photo from Shima who lives in the hillside community of Banigram in Bangladesh. We felt we would like to share with you what we have learned about this lovely looking young lady.

Shima is now 14 years old and she can stay with the Compassion project until she is 22. Her surname is Battacharjee. She speaks Bengali, so as you can imagine we have to have all our letters translated. Most adults in Banigram are unemployed, but Shima's father is a day labourer. Her mother is a housewife and Shima helps with cleaning and buying and selling in the market and she has two sisters.

As a group we get together from time to time to share news of Shima. From the Church Secretary

June seems to be our month for feedback, to listen and to learn. If you have not done so already, please consider completing the church questionnaire about how we use our church buildings. This is available on line at www.surveymonkey.co.uk/r/S3DXDNS

This month we host the 'Exhibition of Users' which allows user groups to mix with one another and for us to learn more about the activities in the church buildings and to get feedback. There are many users of our premises and we have activities for all ages from 'Tots and Carers' to 'Senior Citizens'. Tookey's provides a comfortable meeting place for food and conversations as do the Monday market-day meals served in the hall. The church also meets individual needs such as offering room hire



for counselling and for the volunteer bureau. The insert in June's Inspire shows some of the churches own activities such as morning worship, chapel prayers and bible study groups. So do feel welcome to come along on 24th June between 10am and 4pm to meet and greet at our exhibition. **See page 9.**

Surveys are not new to us. In May 2013 we did a survey on prayer in our church with 66 people filling in the questionnaire. It seemed that prayers of intercession and petition were foremost, followed by prayers of thanks. Prayers of intercession are prayers with, for and on behalf of another person, group of people or even the whole world, seeking the remedying of evil and suffering. Prayers of petition are prayers for ourselves, usually concerned with seeking wholeness in body, mind and spirit. Thanksgiving is for special and everyday things, as well as for the 'mighty acts of God'.

Daily chapel prayers started in our church 37 years ago. We get about 76 prayer requests from people in the town every quarter, showing some of the pastoral needs in our community. These are mainly prayers for others in need. The requests are mainly around life events such as prayers for recovery from physical illness and mental health problems or coping with bereavement.

Our church statements for our LMMR reviews, remind us of how we seek to enrich the spiritual and cultural life of the community. It will be important for us to pause and reflect on the feedback that we will get this summer about how we can best contribute in our town and neighbourhood.


A-CAPELLA EVENING—WITH TWO CHOIRS




